

# Planning for My Career

This lesson is designed to help students explore a variety of careers available using the MEFA Pathway website in order to sort through potential careers, summarize their findings in a presentation, and reflect upon which career they are most drawn to.

## OBJECTIVES

Students will:

1. Learn why knowing about career paths prior to attending college is important for student success
2. Connect information they gathered from the Get to Know You assessment to research at least three careers of interest
3. Evaluate the occupational characteristics of at least three careers of interest
4. Create a presentation that summarizes the occupational characteristics of the three researched careers and provide a written reflection indicating the career that most interests them

## ACTIVITIES

### PART 1

#### Content Knowledge

Ask students why it might be beneficial to figure some of this information out before entering college? Make sure to point to the fact that all majors have different requirements, and while it's not necessarily bad to switch majors, it could lengthen the time they are in college. Tell students that having an idea about the type of career they'd like will allow them to more easily choose a major that is appropriate for that field.

### PART 2

#### Applying Information

Students should complete the Get to Know You assessment in order to narrow their career search. Ask them to pick at least three careers that they want to know more about; it may be a good idea to choose the three that they've already narrowed based on their interests, values, and skills.

---

#### Evaluating Information

Students should take the three careers they've chosen and research the occupational characteristics of each using the MEFA Pathway Career Search page under the Discover Careers tab. Students should take notes on the overview of each job, specific work activities, related occupations, median wages, required education level, and field of studies that could lead them to these careers.

### PART 4

---

#### Critical Thinking/Creative Application

Students should create a presentation on software such as PowerPoint that summarizes each of the careers they've evaluated. They should include all of the required information (overview of the job, specific work activities, related occupations, median wages, required education level, and field of studies that could lead them to these careers) for each career, and it should be in their own words. The presentation should include appropriate graphics that add to the content on the slides. In addition to an opening slide (title, their name, class, teacher name, date), students should also have a concluding slide in which they reflect upon the one career of the researched careers they are most interested in and why.
